

Gary Logue Award Bursaries

The Gary Logue Awards have two individual categories; a patient nominated award and a colleague nominated award. Bowel Cancer UK provide bursary prizes to the winner of each of the individual categories.

Upon acceptance of a bursary from Bowel Cancer UK, you are agreeing to be bound by the terms and conditions below.

Eligibility

- 1.1) The award recipient must currently be employed (full or part time) as a registered health or allied health professional in the UK and provide evidence of this if their application is successful.
- 1.2) The award recipient must be registered with the Health and Care Professions Council (HCPC), or the Nursing and Midwifery Council (NMC).
- 1.3) The award recipient will currently work with people affected by colorectal disease, as a core part of their current employment.
- 1.4) In the event that a team receives an award, a single bursary will be awarded to the team, rather than to the individual members. For example, if a team of 2 nurses win, they will receive a bursary of £300, and not a bursary per individual which would equate to £600.

Use of bursary

- 1.5) The bursary may be used for activity such as professional development, training opportunities, enhancing the patient experience or attending a professional conference.
- 1.6) The bursary must be claimed within 12 months after the recipient receives confirmation of their Gary Logue Awards bursary prize.

Requirements of the award recipient

- 1.7) The award recipient may be asked to submit a case study sharing their experience of the Gary Logue awards and their use of the bursary, this may be used by Bowel Cancer UK to advertise the awards and to secure funding for our education programme.
- 1.9) The award recipient agrees to Bowel Cancer UK publicising their receipt of a bursary from the charity.

Requirements of Bowel Cancer UK

- 2.0) Bowel Cancer UK will provide the award recipient with an official statement of acknowledgement of the bursary.
- 2.1) Bowel Cancer UK reserves the right to make reasonable changes to these terms and conditions, if necessary, both before and after an award recipient receives the bursary.
