- Act as a positive ambassador displaying energy, enthusiasm and commitment
- Following policies and procedures, including safeguarding, as explained before the event day
- Follow staff's directions on the day, to keep you safe and our runners supported

- Experience at a fundraising event



Knowledge, skills and abilities

You don't need any experience or special skills for this role.

- You need a positive attitude and the ability to make people feel welcome
- You'll need to be part of a team and follow directions from charity staff
